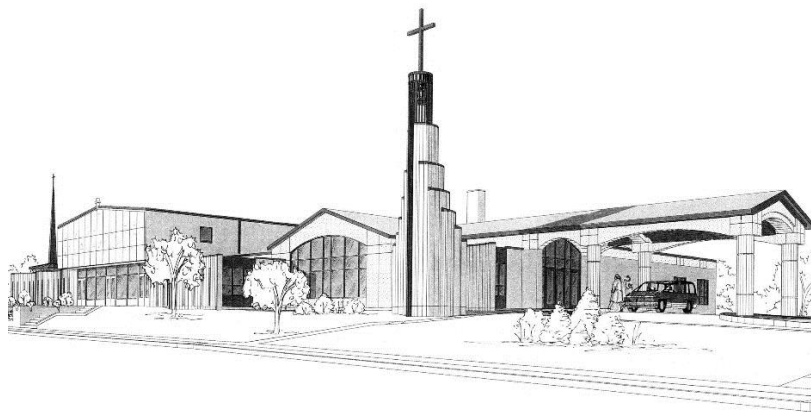

Altar Servers

Partners pick the day of the week that works best for them when it is their scheduled turn. Cleaning takes about 1-2 hours. Anyone is welcome to help out.

Lectors

A lector is the person who proclaims the first or second reading at Mass. Lectors are dedicated and well prepared readers of the Word for every Mass offered in our parish, proclaiming with clarity and conviction. This person also leads the Prayers of the Faithful at Mass as well as the announcements. They are also responsible for carrying in the Book of the Gospels, processing in and out with Father David. Lectors volunteer for all Holiday and special masses. Assigned lector schedules are prepared for four months in advance, with most lectors reading approximately once a month.

Sacristans

Sacristans are responsible for preparing the bread, wine, and vessels about 15-20 minutes prior to the liturgies as well as purifying the vessels after Mass. The time commitment is about 30 minutes *total* before and after Masses and training is provided.

Ushers

Ushers are some of the first and last faces parishioners and guests see at Mass. Ushers help seat parishioners and guests, find a family to bring the gifts of bread and wine forward at the presentation, take up the collection, and distribute bulletins. RCIA Team

RCIA, or the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the formation process for people who are seeking initiation into the Catholic Church. The RCIA Team works with those seeking initiation in conjunction with the Holy Spirit, parish community, and Director of Adult Ministries to help seekers learn about our Faith, prepare for Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil, and be lifelong faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. Instead, a substitute is placed on a list that is used when a catechist assigned to a regular class is ill or needs to be absent from their classroom. A substitute may be available for all grades in the entire morning program and/or evening program, or a specific grade level(s). A substitute may know a week or more in advance, or could be called on short notice Sunday to fill in for an ill catechist. Training provided.

School Garden

The school garden exposes students in all grades to life sciences in a practical application of knowledge learned in the science class. Students & teachers are involved in planning and planting the garden in the springtime. In the fall, we all revisit the garden to observe changes, and to harvest. As is practical, the harvest is used or donated to the local food pantry. Time commitment is generally two hours weekly, depending on the needs of the garden. Planning is an hour or so. Garden prep in the spring is definitely a few hours, depending on the weather. Weeding, watering, and general maintenance is usually a few hours each week through the summer months. Once school starts, one hour per week for watering, weeding, harvesting.
