Tuesday January 9, 2007, 6:30

Present: Father David, Pat Devine, Audrey Rhinehart, Scott Kenitz

We briefly discussed Sunday service in the absence of a priest. Father has delegated the recruitment of potential service leaders to Sister Eileen, and noted that she would be a first option. The goal is to have at least 2 parishioners who would be willing to lead at each of the three mass times. Scott will forward the list of possible candidates from our last meeting to Sister Eileen.

We discussed considerations for presenters of our parish mission. Father David mentioned a Capuchin group that was good. He will discuss options with Sister Eileen and we will discuss it again at our next meeting. We are targeting an early November date.

We made preliminary plans for Lent and Holy Week as follows:

Ash Wednesday masses: 8:20 and 7:00 pm; 12:00 pm Scripture Service and Distribution of the Ashes

Holy Thursday: 7:00 mass and washing of the feet, followed by a Seder meal (Father has done this at other parishes-families that want to participate bring sliced roast beef and a potato, drop it off in the cafeteria before mass to stay heated, the parish provides rolls, salad, and beverage and we share the meal in the cafeteria after mass in the Jewish tradition)

Good Friday: 1:00 pm Liturgical Service and 7:00 Service

Easter Vigil: 8:00 with the opening fire/lighting neat the baptismal font

Easter Sunday: 8:30 and 10:45

Finally, we discussed having a Valentine's Day evening event, called "Valentino's Cabaret". This would be a peaceful, relaxing evening held in the gathering space with volunteers preparing desserts and providing coffee/cappuccino/maybe espresso. Father David will talk to Angela and June about possible volunteers from school or the REC program, or scouts. We would have to rent a cappuccino maker. It would be 6-8 pm. We will follow through per Father David's direction.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday February 6 at 6:30 in the staff room.
